

Task Policy Tilburgse Studenten Basketbalvereniging Pendragon



1. Every competition-playing member (hereinafter referred to as: member) must be able to referee at least at the BS2 level (former F-level).
2. If a member does not hold a valid referee certificate (minimum BS2 or F), he/she is obliged to still obtain it. At the beginning of each season, a referee course will be organized by TSBV Pendragon (hereinafter referred to as: association). Participation in this course is compulsory. If a member fails to attend the course or completes the course without success, the member will be excluded from the competition. In the event that there are compelling reasons not to participate in the course, an exception may be made to the above rule. A request for such an exception should be submitted by e-mail to the SKP in good time, at least 48 hours before the start of the course.
 - 2.1. An exception to the obligation mentioned in articles 1 and 2 may be made for members/exchange students who are only registered with the association for six months.
3. If a member does not possess a valid BS3 referee's diploma, they are obligated to obtain one. TSBV Pendragon organizes referee courses for this purpose. Attendance at this course is mandatory. In cases where there are compelling reasons for not attending the course, the board may make exceptions to this rule.
 - 3.1. An exception to the obligation mentioned in article 3 can be made for members/exchange students who are registered with the association for a year or less.
 - 3.2. Another exception to the obligation mentioned in article 3 can be made for members that have obtained the BS2, who do not compete at a level where a BS3 level or higher (i.e BS4) is required for.
4. Every member, including new members, are expected to be able to perform all table tasks (scorer, timer and 24-second operator). At the beginning of each season, a table course will be organized by the association where everyone can gain the necessary knowledge to perform all table tasks. If the course has not been used, a member is responsible for possessing the appropriate knowledge themselves.
5. When making the task schedule, the matches of the team for which a member is selected are taken into account. Matches of any second team are not taken into account. The division of tasks is final once the SKP has sent the task schedule to the members. Each member is then responsible for the task assigned to him/her.
 - 5.1. If the SKP-er wishes to make corrections to the already task schedule, this is possible 14 days before the match. The revised version serves as the leading version.

6. If a member is unable to perform a task, he/she is responsible for arranging a replacement for the task. A member remains responsible for a task until he/she submits a takeover request in writing to the SKP. The takeover is final when authorized by the SKP'er. After giving this consent, responsibility for the task shifts to the replacing member.
7. A member on duty on a match night must be present in the hall at least 10 (ten) minutes before the start of the match.
 - 7.1. If the member in question thinks in advance that he/she will not be able to meet this attendance of 10 minutes before the start of the match, the member must communicate this at least 4 hours before the start of the match with the designated hall watch for the evening, including a valid reason.
 - 7.2. If the member, without communicating this, is present in the hall later than 10 minutes before the start of the match, an official warning will initially be issued to the member in question.
 - 7.3. If this same member is present in the hall later than 10 minutes before the start of the match every subsequent time without prior communication and/or valid reason, a fine of 10 (ten) euros will be issued to the member in question.
8. All members should make a commitment to the proper functioning of the association in equal measure. A points system is used for this purpose, which keeps track of the distribution of tasks as fairly as possible. Points are awarded to all tasks performed for the association. Board members, coaches and registered referees are exempt from tasks. Participation in committees also earns points. The SKP supervises the distribution and execution of tasks and ensures that it is as fair as possible.
9. A member can obtain double points if he/she performs a task at the last minute (crunch task). The SKP or hall watch will clearly indicate when this is the case.
10. To accommodate members who often take over tasks and/or keep members motivated to perform tasks, at the end of each season the SKP will determine what the points system's threshold value was for the season, in order to qualify for a reward from the association (e.g. a voucher, liquor, active member drinks etc.).
11. Twice a season, a points overview will appear in the club magazine Flodder, showing how many points can be earned per task/committee. It is also possible at all times for members to check with the SKP to see how this member is doing in terms of SKP points.
12. The SKP point system:

Task	Points	
	Table duty	2
	Home Referee	3

13. Sanctions for the neglect of duties:

	Home	Away
1 st Penalty	20 euro	The fine imposed by the league (minimum 10 euros) and 20 euros.
2 nd Penalty	30 euro and 1 match suspension	The fine imposed by the league (minimum 10 euros), 30 euros and 1 match suspension.
3 rd Penalty	40 euro and permanent suspension	The fine imposed by the league (minimum 10 euros), 40 euros and a permanent suspension.

After a fine is imposed for neglecting a task, the member may not play matches again until the fine is paid. The task, of course, does not expire. In the following schedule, the task must be made up to maintain evenness. Forfeiting to do fewer tasks that way does not work.

14. If a member fails to turn up to a task, the coach of his/her team will be informed and informed of the penalties for the member in question.
15. The tasks should be clear to everyone who joins TSBV Pendragon. That way, members will not face any surprises and know what obligations come with playing at TSBV Pendragon. To make the rules in the tasks policy known to the entire association, they are published on the website and placed in the first Flodder of the season.
